- **PATROL**

- **May 20th** – Officers responded to Frank Wagner Auditorium with a report of multiple electronic items missing from the IT room. Included in the missing were 14 new laptops that had been removed from their boxes. Officers discovered a window that had been covered with plywood that had been removed that had been accessed from the roof. On May 24th Evidence Technician Renee' Acree was searching Offer-up and found one of the laptops had been listed the day after the burglary. The case was then transferred to the ProAct team who contacted the party selling the laptop. Through investigation, six juvenile male suspects, ages 15-16, were identified. Charges pending include Stolen Property Trafficking, Theft 1, Burglary 2 and Making false statements to a public servant. Ten of the laptops have been recovered along with two new Tablets that were not yet discovered as stolen. Great work by Evidence Tech Acree and ProAct.



- **May 8th** – Officer Kornish made a traffic stop on a vehicle leaving Al Borlin Park. Drug Paraphernalia was in plain view, consent to search recovered 1.4 grams of Methamphetamine, .2 grams of Heroin and an additional 21.7 grams of Methamphetamine found in the driver’s backpack. Driver booked on multiple drug charges and for an outstanding Domestic Violence warrant.
