
Monthly Council Report

March 2020



- **SIGNIFICANT CASES/EVENTS**

- **April 19, 2020** – Officers responded to a residential house fire and were told that there was one child still in the house. The officers quickly entered the home and searched for the girl through a smoked filled hallway. Officer Patton came upon a bedroom with visible flames and upon calling out for the child with no answer, closed the door. They could not locate the child and exited upon the arrival of the firefighters. Medic 31 was able to locate the child in a closed toy trunk in an adjacent bedroom and brought her outside the home to safety. Snohomish County Fire District 7 thanked the police officers for their quick thinking in closing the bedroom door that helped contain the fire.



- **April 13, 2020** – Officer Steinbach responded to a suspicious call for possible drug activity in the parking lot of a grocery store. She arrived on scene and observed behavior by the male in the vehicle that was consistent with a narcotics user. Officer Steinbach then contacted the subject and observed in plain sight what appeared to be illegal narcotics. The vehicle was impounded and a search warrant was obtained. The search warrant located 17.6 grams of meth, 1.8 grams of heroin, and drug paraphernalia.




- **April 8, 2020** – Officer Kornish observed what appeared to be a drug deal in a gas station parking lot. He contacted one of the subjects who subsequently confessed to selling drugs. The subject's vehicle was impounded and a search warrant was served which resulted in 53 grams of meth, 14.4 grams heroin, 63 M/30 blues suspect fentanyl, 59 sub strips, 20 zan bars, 42 unidentified pills, and \$850 cash.



- **WSR EVENTS**

- **April 16, 2020** – The department received a list from WASPC of DOC offenders to be released pursuant to Governor Inslee’s plan. 85 offenders were on the list whose county of origin was listed as Snohomish.
- **April 14, 2020** – Officers responded to the report of a bomb under the Community Corrections Building. A female called claiming she had C4 and was tired of seeing the prisoners “exploited.” WSP bomb squad and K9’s responded. No evidence of explosives were located. The origination of the bomb call is being investigated.
- **April 9, 2020** – Assisted at WSR with inmate riot. Inmates were not outside the fence just refusing to go inside. Monroe PD, SCSO, WSP, Lake Stevens PD assisted with the perimeter during this incident.
- **April 6, 2020** – A few family members of inmates organized a protest/demonstration due to an inmate being diagnosed with COVID-19.
