FACE COVERINGS REQUIRED IN PLACES OF BUSINESS

Effective this past Tuesday, July 7, customers are required to wear cloth face coverings or face masks in places of business. Late last week, Governor Jay Inslee and Secretary of Health John Wiesman [extended](#) the state's face covering requirement to include businesses. Under this requirement, businesses are responsible for their customers wearing face coverings, and may not serve customers who do not comply with the statewide face covering order. I encourage all residents to wear face coverings in support our business community, as they strive to serve their customers and follow state guidelines.



IN NEED OF RENTAL ASSISTANCE DUE TO COVID-19?

The Coronavirus Relief Prevention Program has announced a rental assistance program which will provide



up to three months of rental assistance for eligible Snohomish County households. Administered locally through Volunteers of America, the program will provide assistance to households in Snohomish County who are unable to pay rent due to the loss of primary income from a COVID-19-related job loss. Additionally, eligible households will have at least one member age 65 or older, or a member with an underlying medical condition. Qualifying households will be able to receive up to three months of rent assistance, including amounts in arrears, or relocation to another unit if the current unit is no longer affordable. Flyers detailing the program are available in [English](#) and [Spanish](#). Households in need of rental assistance should call 2-1-1 to complete the eligibility screening.

FREE YOUTH LIFE JACKET GIVEAWAY AT EVERGREEN STATE FAIR PARK

Coastal Farm and Ranch is hosting a [Free Youth Life Jacket Giveaway](#) event tomorrow, July 11,

at the Evergreen State Fair Park. Three-hundred life jackets will be given away free of charge for kids 12 and younger. This drive-through event will take place between 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m., and will be a socially-distanced, contactless event. There is no need to bring the kiddos or

even get out of the car; all you will need to know is how much each child weighs. Three sizes of life jackets will be available while supplies last:



Infant sizing: up to 50 lbs.

Child sizing: 33 to 55 lbs.

Youth sizing: 55 to 88 lbs.

CITY ANNUAL PAVING PROGRAM UNDERWAY

Construction work kicked off this week for the City's Annual Paving Program. The work includes pavement grinding and new asphalt surfacing on various roads throughout Monroe, including sections of Beaton Road, Tye Street, 172nd Drive SE, Cascade View Drive, 177th Avenue SE, Village Way, and 154th Street SE. In addition, existing sidewalk ramps adjacent to the project areas are reconstructed as necessary to be compliant with current ADA standards. This project is expected to wrap up in September.
