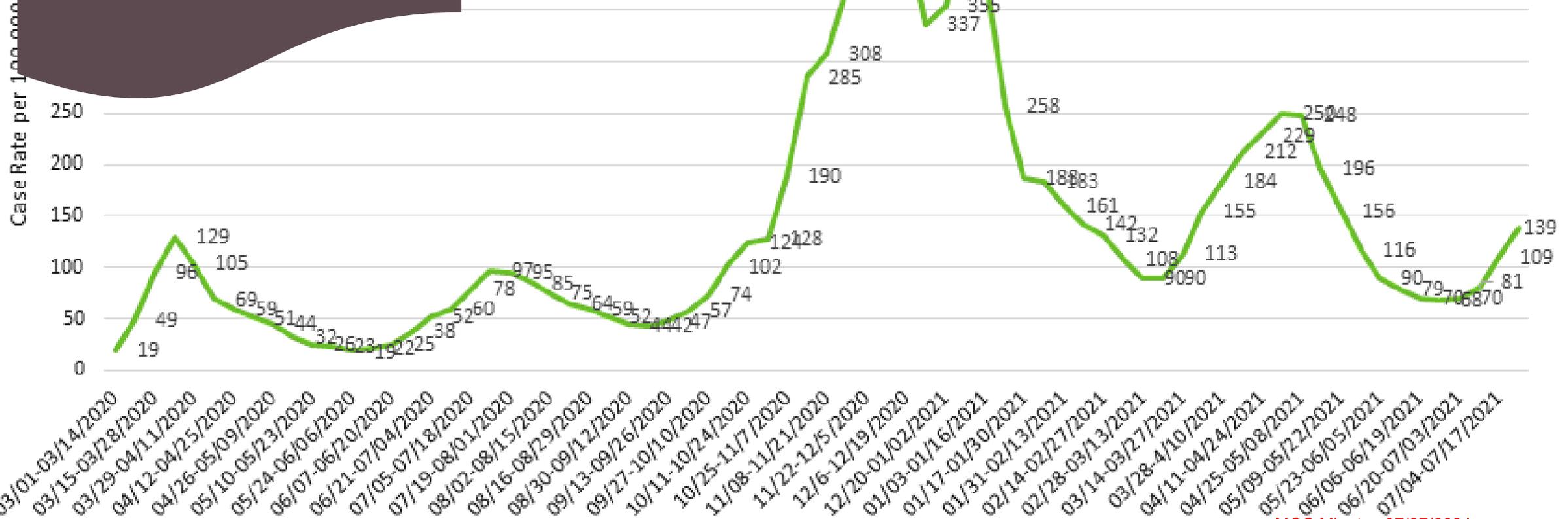

CASE RATE PER 100,000 FOR 2-WEEK ROLLING PERIOD

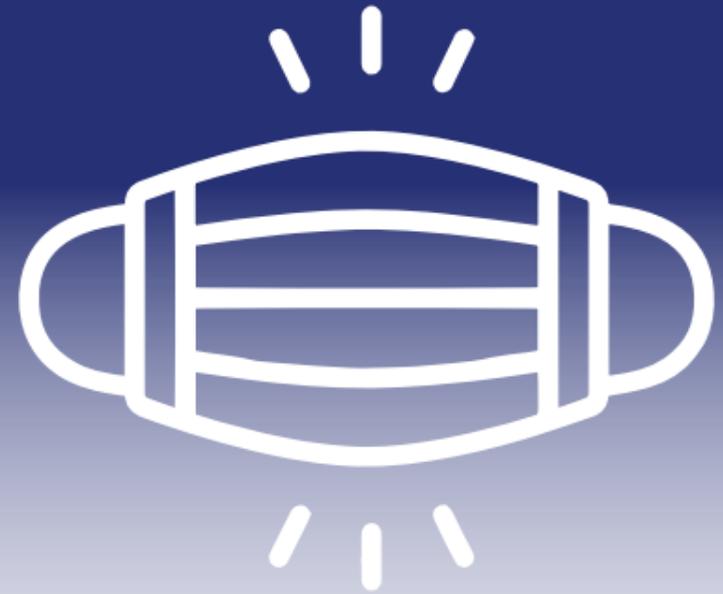
