# CITY RECRUITING FOR ENGINEERING SERVICES MANAGER

The City of Monroe is currently recruiting for an Engineering Services Manager. The individual in this position will plan, organize, and direct the work of professional and technical staff performing technical engineering tasks, land development and plan review processes, civil inspections of capital and private construction projects, and capital project management. They will also provide technical assistance to the Public Works Director, City Engineer, Boards, Commissions, and other staff members. The successful candidate will have a Bachelor of Science in Engineering with major course work in civil, structural, or traffic engineering, along with seven years of progressively responsible experience in a "hands on" engineering position and five years of supervisory experience in a professional engineering position or an equivalent combination of education and experience that meets departmental needs.


