***Recognizing May 2024 as Asian American
and Pacific Islander Heritage Month***



WHEREAS, since 1978 the United States has observed the month of May as Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage Month to celebrate the many rich contributions that people of Asian and Pacific Islander ancestry have made to our nation and communities; and

WHEREAS, the Asian and Pacific Islander community consists of approximately 50 ethnic groups speaking over 100 languages with over 1,000 different dialects in the United States; and

WHEREAS, it is crucial that *We the People* remember that Americans' history and America's experience would not have been realized but for the contributions of people from all different races, cultures, genders, religions, economic classes, and lived experiences and further that we should both honor and give thanks for people and communities that have made America a better place and made and continue to make us a better people; and
