ORDINANCE NO. 007/2024

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MONROE,
WASHINGTON, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 006/2012;
PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND ESTABLISHING AN
EFFECTIVE DATE

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2012, the City Council of the City of Monroe passed Ordinance No. 006/2012 requiring any ordinance that authorizes the use of automated ticketing cameras enacted after January 1, 2007, be put on the ballot as an advisory vote of the people at the next general election; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Monroe passed Resolution No. 2012/009 declaring its intent to repeal Ordinance No. 006/2012 if the City prevailed in its appeal of the Snohomish County Superior Court's decision in Cause No. 11-2-06796-1; and

WHEREAS, on February 25, 2013 the City of Monroe prevailed in its appeal of the Snohomish County Superior Court's decision with the Appeals Court of Washington reversing the trial courts order denying the city's motion for summary judgement with regard to Section 3 of proposed Monroe Initiative No. 1 through Cause No. 68473-6-1; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Monroe proposes to follow the intent of Resolution No. 2012/009 by repealing Ordinance No. 006/2012.

NOW THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MONROE DO
ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Repeal of Ordinance. Ordinance No. 006/2012 is hereby repealed in its entirety.

Section 2. Severability. If any section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance should be held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such invalidity or unconstitutionality shall not affect the validity or constitutionality of any other section, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect five (5) days from and after its passage and approval and publication as required by law.
