WHAT TO DO IF YOU LOST OR FOUND A PET

If you believe your pet is lost, we encourage you to first search your neighborhood and talk with your neighbors. Then check local social media sites like Facebook and Nextdoor. You can also contact our Police Department to see if they have it. If you find a pet, check the collar for owner information and the same local social sites. Contact the Police Department

for a microchip scan that will help identify the owner. In Monroe, pet licenses aren't required for most household pets, although we do ask that you keep microchip and collar information up to date. This helps in reuniting the lost or found pet with its owner. If you need help from the Police Department, call 360-794-6300 (Mon.-Fri., 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.) or after hours at 425-407-3999 (non-emergency).
