MONROE'S HERITAGE TREE PROGRAM

I'd like to remind our community of the City's Heritage Tree Program and Registry. Launched in 2018 and sponsored by the City, Monroe Park Board, and Monroe Historical Society, the program identifies and honors unique and significant trees in the community. Trees can be native, or non-native species and be located on either private property or public lands. Ninety percent of the tree must be visible from a public right of way (ROW). The categories for Heritage Trees are:



1. **Specimen** - a tree of exceptional size, form, or rarity.
2. **Historic** - a tree recognized by virtue of its age, its association with, or contribution to a historic structure or district, or, its association with a noted person or historic event.
3. **Landmark** - trees that are community landmarks.
4. **Collection** - several trees in a notable grove, avenue, or other planting.

Fall is a great time to take crisp, brisk walks around the City and look for these Heritage Trees. Nomination forms can be [found online](#), or by stopping by Monroe City Hall and speaking to one of our parks staff. [View the current Heritage Tree Flyer here.](#)

CELEBRATING MONROE'S DOWNTOWN HISTORIC BUILDINGS - NOV. 1 AT 1 P.M.

On Saturday, November 1, at 1 p.m., at the corner of Lewis Street and Main Street, the [Monroe Historical Society](#) will host a special dedication and ribbon cutting ceremony to unveil bronze plaques recognizing three of our city's century old buildings:

- The 1901 Dolloff-Key Building,
- The 1905 Hallan Building, and
- The 1908 original City Hall Building.

Local officials, stakeholders, and building owners will all be present to take part in the ceremony and share stories of these historic buildings. The historic

plaque program is supported by donations from local organizations and individuals aiming to highlight the unique structures and qualities of our downtown. Join us as we celebrate the people and places that connect Monroe's past to its vibrant present.
